Exodus 33:18-19 NKJV

“Lord, show me your glory.” Moses saw the Lord in a flaming bush. The glory the Lord manifested in fire, spiritual fire, before him. What an encounter in his call and his destiny. He says, “*Show me Your glory.*” God says, “*I am going to make all My goodness pass before you, and I will proclaim the name of the Lord before you. I will be gracious to whom I will be gracious. I will have compassion on whom I will have compassion.*”

That reveals the heart of the Father, amen. He calls it glory. There is a method, and there is a way of the Lord. There is an anointing of God in how He comes to us and how He reveals His goodness to us. Isn't that amazing! Every day I ask the Lord, “Show me your glory.” It's not like I haven't seen it, but every day is a new day. Yes, it's intimate. You want to know Him. How close do you really want to be? He gives us that opportunity, doesn't He?

Psalms 33:13-14, 18 AMPC

“*The Lord looks from Heaven. He beholds all of the sons of men. From His dwelling place, He looks intently, upon all the inhabitants of the earth. He Who fashions the hearts of them all, Who considers all of their doings.*”

18) “*Behold, the Lord's eye is upon those who fear Him, who revere and worship Him with awe, who wait for Him and hope in His mercy and His loving kindness.*”

Beautiful, everything I just told you right there. He is looking for a place to dwell. Looking for a heart to fashion and form in His image. We entered into that glory, to have access to the fullness of the Holy Spirit on the planet. While we're still here working through our stuff. What grace and mercy, His mercy. We wait for Him, and we hope in His mercy every morning. “*His mercies are new every morning.*”

Second Chronicles 16:9 NLT

“*The eyes of the Lord search the whole earth in order to strengthen those whose hearts are fully committed to Him.*”

He is looking. His eyes are looking to and fro. The fullness of the Holy Spirit is hovering over the entire planet, looking. Looking to where the Father would say, “that one.” The eyes of the Lord are manifested and revealed in our Spirit, which is the eye and the lamp of who we are, and it wakes up. Psalm 86:15 NKJV

"But you, O Lord, are a God full of compassion, and gracious, longsuffering and abundant in mercy and truth."
You, Lord God, are full of compassion, gracious, long suffering, abundant in mercy and truth.

Proverbs 15:3 NKJV

"The eyes of the Lord are in every place, keeping watch on the evil and good."

Sounds repetitive, right? I just pulled a few that *show* the Lord's trying to break through to humans. Now, that's the sovereignty of God. That's the Lord God. The Lord God Almighty, the Father of glory, yes, the whole Godhead. Thank you, Jesus, that, *"The eyes of the Lord are in every place."* We are not alone. *"He is keeping watch on the evil and the good."* He is keeping watch. Now, He knows when He's going to move. Ecclesiastes 5:1 AMP

What moves the hand of God? What moved Christ? What you see in God's Word shall move you to act. When you read the Scripture, the Spirit of God stirs it, and it moves you to obey. When you read the Scripture, it moves on you and you act, you respond, you pray, you worship, you go, you do. Yes. He says, "Go, pray for the sick." You go pray for the sick. Yes, what you see in the Word of God shall move on you to act. That's why it's called the book of Acts, right? We believe in our heart. Then we have to act on that faith and do, yes? He said, "Go serve, go heal, go save, and go help." It's all to know by faith that all things are possible to those who believe. We carry that mantle. We are supernatural, born again, holy ones set apart for His good pleasure, and we carry the hope. The hope of the Gospel and the glory.

He needs us. He wants us. He chose to use us. That's amazing. God gives new sight and He gives new vision. His word will give us life. Jesus said, "I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life." His word gives us life. His word will give us direction. His word will give us insight. His word will give us knowledge. His word will give us wisdom. Truth upon truth, because that's what it looks like.

He builds, and He builds a strong edifice within the saints. That's why He says, pray in the Spirit all times, right? As you pray in the Spirit, you are actually building an edification, a fortress, a house edified, a stronghold. You're building up your most holy faith when you pray in the Spirit. Yes, that's true. Why? Because you're communing with the Spirit of God when you pray in the Spirit, wow. You talk about focus of glory. The Holy Ghost knows exactly what we need. He builds us up morning by morning, day by day. You pray in the Spirit with God. Isn't that beautiful?

Faith sees. One of God's names is El Roi, and that means, "God who sees." He is not asleep. He's not caught off guard. He's not hindered by the darkness. He sees injustices. He sees it all, and He promises to judge righteously. He promises us that. His eyes are always looking upon the good and evil. He's watching over it. Thank God. We have God who is watching over all, and we intercede with Him. But, you know what? He's God. You know? I have this really close relationship to say, "Lord, I need you to be God. Be God." It starts here, but oh, there is a great reward coming. So don't grow weary in doing good. "Show me Your glory." He says, "I am going to let all My goodness and all My compassion come before you." That gives me a key to the glory of the Lord.

First John 5:4-5 NKJV

"For whatever is born of God overcomes the world." Say, 'That's me.' "And this is the victory that has overcome the world— our faith."

Romans 12:21 NKJV

There is no way we could do that without the glory of the Lord. "Do not be overcome by evil." That is a command. That is a command now that we're born again. When we were lost, we were overcome by evil, doing the best we could, right? "Overcome evil with good." Now, that's going to affect a lot of areas in our lives. Acts 10:38 NKJV

Matthew 14:14 NKJV

If He needed to rebuke a Pharisee, He rebuked a Pharisee, right? That's our King, and it all came out of His compassion. I don't drive up and knock on their car, asking, "Do you believe in Jesus, your Lord and Savior." Okay, there's a time for that.

Mark 1:40-42 NKJV

This is our God. Jesus was obviously moved by compassion through His cross in order to save everybody who would call upon His name. He was moved by compassion through the cross. Wow, He went all the way, didn't He? He demonstrated what true compassion is and that's why He said, "Now, you Beloved, take up your cross daily, deny yourself and follow me." That's our life, yes. There's the compassion. *"He opposes the proud, but He gives grace to the humble, because without Him, we can do nothing."* He is faithful and He is true. Jesus always moved and acted. He always did something about it. I love that, because if you think of the entire globe of the church, what a movement. What a movement that through His whole body, globally, He's moving. The eyes of the Lord are there with compassion and mercy. What a movement.

There is a river, correct? Jesus is the Source, the Way, the Truth and the Life. A river cannot flow upstream. The River of Life is going to flow from God to His family and ministers first. The river flows from the Godhead, the Head, the Church, His source and ongoing ministers of life in abundance. He has given authority to the Church to host this kind of authority and power and compassion. He moves in order towards us. One river, one movement, that begins and ends with Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit is directing that flow. He is the Source. What a mighty God. He strengthens us in Who He is.

Colossians 1:18 NIV

"And He is the Head of the Body, the Church. He is the beginning and the first born from among the dead, so that in everything, He might have the supremacy."

Supremacy, that's a big word. Yes, God has the supremacy, and we are His body. We come in line with His will. Then, He uses us in that supremacy to bring forth His will and accomplish His good work. He is Head of the Body. He is Head of the Church. You see that? He is the Beginning and the First Born from among the dead. He is the First Born, and we will follow in like suit, truth. Proverbs 16:22 AMP

"Understanding, spiritual insight, is a refreshing and boundless wellspring of life to those who have it."
