

The Spirit of Might - transcript

July 5th, 2026

So let me pray over this word and it'll be good. So Jesus, we thank You for joining Your house and all of Your blessings. And I ask, Holy Spirit, that You would impart to everybody hearing, listening, watching, and those who are here, that You would do what You do, Lord, and that You would touch every heart and impart and set apart and deliver and just bring revelation to Your heart today. We thank You for opening our ears and our eyes to see it, to know it, and understand it, and receive it. In Jesus' name, amen. Amen.

All right, so everybody say, Lord, I stand in awe of You. I think that should be our prayer and our desire and our words that we express to Him every week, every day. Lord, I just stand in awe of You. We need to give Him our highest praise, not just on Sundays or Wednesdays or special times, right? But, Lord, we stand in awe of You, okay?

The Lord our God releases supernatural abilities and strength within us. Okay, so He carries an awe and a wonder about Him, doesn't He? And He is holy, and He's altogether wonderful and glorious. And of course, He releases supernatural abilities. He is supernatural. He is all in all. And He strengthens His saints. And every time we gather in His name, every time you read His word, every time you're abiding in prayer, He strengthens us. Yes?

You don't necessarily have to see the angels that are ministering to you, but the angels are ministering to you 24-7. The angels of the Lord are protecting you, guarding you, and keeping you. Maybe when we get to heaven, we can watch the movie. I don't know, but I just think it's really glorious. You have to always be spiritual-minded and to know that the Spirit of the living God lives inside of us, and His kingdom of heaven abides with us and around us, and His angel armies guard us and keep us. And praise the Lord for that.

But God wants to impart and reveal to us the spirit of might today. Okay? So we're going to go to Isaiah 11:1–2. We are familiar with this. It's a glorious word. God releases supernatural abilities and strength in us. We're going to highlight the spirit of might according to His will this morning.

Isaiah 11:1–2 speaks of Christ, of Jesus. He says, there shall come forth a rod from the stem of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of His roots, and the Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon Him, and the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, and the Spirit of counsel and of might, and the Spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord.

We know this as the fullness, the sevenfold Spirit of God. Holy Ghost and all of His fullness. And the Lord chose to tell thus this. The Lord chose, in the writing of His word, in revelation to humanity, for us to see and know who He is in more depth. He's not just God, right? He is. I am that I am. And He covers everything. And for Him to express His heart here and say that upon My Son, the Christ, the Messiah, the fullness of My Spirit will rest upon Him. Hallelujah.

The fullness of the Spirit of the Lord, the fullness of the Spirit of wisdom, the fullness of the Spirit of understanding, the fullness of the Spirit of counsel, the fullness of the Spirit of might, the fullness of the Spirit of knowledge, the fullness of the Spirit of the fear of the Lord. He didn't just move in a gift. Right? He carried the mantles, clothed in fullness, never lacking in any of these things. Isn't that powerful? This is our Jesus. Say amen. Amen.

Now, in talking about the spirit of might, I'm going to give you a few examples today. But I want to say this. We all don't have to be like Samson to encounter the spirit of might. Right? Samson was given supernatural physical strength, truly empowered by the Spirit of Might. And you can read his whole story in Judges 14–16. I'm not going to read it all to you today. But I'm going to summarize some bullet points from just the commentary from my study Bible on the Spirit of Might and God's strength in Samson.

So most of us are familiar with this, and there's a lot of story behind it. Samson was known for his strength. He literally was filled and baptized in the Spirit of might, though he was not born again from above. You understand? He was called a choice and anointed and appointed to walk in the fullness with the Spirit of might. So much that Samson tore a lion apart with his bare hands, right? He killed a lion. Now, how many of you guys have done that today? Nor do I shall want to try.

Samson tore a lion apart with his bare hands. He slayed a thousand Philistines. He killed a thousand Philistines using the jawbone of a donkey. He carried away the gates of a city to the hilltop. He uprooted the literal city gates, which were huge, right? It wasn't just our little squeaky iron gate. He encountered miraculous escapes more than once from the enemy. He escaped from all the bindings that were meant to restrain him. So no matter how much they did to restrain him to try to crush his strength, he broke through every one of them.

Samson repeatedly escaped from traps that were set by the Philistines, demonstrating his extraordinary strength and ability. In his final act, he pulled down the pillars of Dagon's temple, which was a false god, killing himself and many Philistines with him. Wow. So I encourage all of you to read that again. They talk about it in the Sunday school. I remember, believe it or not, I remember reading a little Bible story about Samson, and I thought that was pretty amazing.

But what I did not know was that the spirit of might was upon him in fullness. I knew nothing about the Spirit of Might. I knew nothing about Holy Spirit and how Holy Spirit would come upon an individual and how God would take these individuals and use them for His glory and His purposes throughout all history, correct? And it's important to know that even though He was not born again from above yet and had Holy Ghost in Him, the Spirit of Might would come upon them, yes? The Spirit of the Lord was upon them. And it says here that the Spirit of the Lord is upon Jesus Christ and in Jesus Christ and He is the fullness of it. Holy Ghost is so powerful, yes?

And so if you could go to Zechariah 4:6, please. The Lord wants to impart to all of us what I call fresh oil in the spirit of might. The Lord wants to meet us where we're at. Now He knows where we're at. Everybody, you know where you're at. And He wants to meet us in the spirit of might. He wants us to have ongoing revelation in the spirit of might. Zechariah 4:6 states this: So he answered and said unto me, this is the word of the Lord to Zerubbabel. It's not by might nor by power, but by My Spirit, says the Lord. Now that sounds awesome. Not by might nor by power. It sounds as it's contradicting, but it is not. It is not by human might. It is not by human power. Yes? It is not by human strength, but by My Spirit. And He is referring to the fullness of the spirit of might here. Yes, not by might nor by power, but by My Spirit, says the Lord.

We know, according to Philippians 4:13, the Scripture says, I can do all things through Christ, the Anointed One, His Anointed, who strengthens me. Well, the Spirit of might strengthens us. The Spirit of Might strengthens us every day. We don't have to just wait for a supernatural encounter and big battle and overwhelming, amazing, something God happened to experience the Spirit of Might. I encounter the Spirit of Might every day. And the Apostle Paul knew this. I can do all things through Christ, the Anointed Wisdom, who holds and manifests and stewards the fullness of the Spirit of God. For the Spirit of the Lord rests upon Him, wisdom, understanding, counsel, might, knowledge, and the fear of the Lord. So when we are submitted to Christ, we have the fullness of His Spirit ministering to us. We are undercover. Say, I'm so undercover. I'm kept, and He lives in me. Okay, this is the reality, right? That's why we read the word. That's why we teach. We learn, we submit ourselves because faith comes from hearing and hearing by the word of God. Truth? Wow.

Now let's go to Jude 1:20. Well, it's just one chapter, so won't be too hard to find. It's one of my favorites. The spirit of might. Okay, we're going to start with verse 20. It says, but you, beloved church, building yourselves up on your most holy faith, praying in Holy Spirit. That's praying in tongues, the spiritual language in the spirit. Keep yourselves in the love of God, looking for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ unto eternal life. And on some have

compassion, making a distinction but others saved with fear, pulling them out of the fire, hating even the garment that was polluted and defiled by the flesh.

Jude 1:24 says, Now to Him who is able to keep you from stumbling, and presents you faultless, before the presence of His glory with exceeding joy to God our Savior, who alone is wise, be glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and forever. Amen. But you, beloved church, individual saints, build yourself up by praying in the most holy faith, praying in Holy Spirit, who is wisdom, revelation, knowledge, counsel, might, power, strength, knowledge. You understand this. You are praying with Holy Spirit. You are praying with power. You are praying with the glory of the Lord. Because now, because of Jesus, the Holy Ghost lives inside of us. He doesn't just come upon us. Yes? But there are times when He comes upon us in a fresh and holy fire. Yes? But He lives with us every day.

That's why it says, Now to Him who is able to keep us from stumbling, He is the one that presents us faultless before His presence with His glory and exceeding joy. And He gets us such high praise. And this is what the glory of the Lord does. To God our Savior, who alone is wise. Your boast goes in God, not yourself. Yes? We are weak in nothing. But to God our Savior, who alone is wise, be glory, majesty, power, dominion. You hear it? And you can feel the praises rise. And when you do that individually, corporately, all through the week, either way, the glory of the Lord is there.

Now we know that the Church of Jesus Christ, we work with Jesus to build His church. We are working with Jesus while He builds His church. Go to Matthew 16:18–19. He builds His church in the fullness of Holy Spirit, which includes the Spirit of Might. The Holy Spirit, you cannot take the Spirit of Might from Holy Spirit. He's the Spirit of Might. You can't take that from Him. No form of religion or false doctrine can take that from Holy Ghost. Yes? He is wisdom, revelation, knowledge, counsel, and might. He is the glory. Amen.

Matthew 16:18–19 says, And I say to you that you are Peter, whoa. And on this rock I will build My church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it. And I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven. Jesus Christ is building His church in the fullness of Holy Spirit. Jesus Christ is building His church in the fullness of Holy Spirit. Not just a little, He builds in the fullness, which includes the spirit of might.

Now, in my lifetime, I have not experienced a modern-day Samson doing any of these kinds of works. I don't live all around the globe. I feel confident it's been done and being done since then. I'm just not there. But God knows, yes. But the greater wonder is that the Lord God would choose to put the Spirit of might upon His church and in every individual saint

to do His work. Isn't that amazing? And the gates of hell cannot prevail against it. Jesus Christ, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, will never leave us, correct?

The more access you have to Christ, the less access you need for outside help. The more access, the more communion, the more abiding, the more revelation of Jesus Christ, who is clothed in the fullness of the Spirit, the less need you have to get help somewhere outside of Him. The whole goal is to abide in Him. Yes? The whole goal, I'm in Him and He's in me. The whole goal is for you to love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind, one strength. Yes? The whole goal is for you to receive and have communion with this great God. We are called to look to the rock to whom we are formed. Amen. He's the rock and I don't need to look any further.

God will empower us as we allow Him to bring His counsel to us. God will empower us as we allow Him to bring His counsel. Yes, He develops His nature within us daily as we yield to His heart and His ways and He heals our souls. In this, I want you to see the Lord connected the spirit of counsel with the spirit of might. Now, some of us may have heard of counselors. I'm going to go get counsel. You can do that spiritually with the church, Body of Christ ministers, or psychologists or any form of help that's out there for people in need, correct? But by God's grace, He has put counsel and might together for a purpose.

And so God wants us, individually and corporately, to be able to go to Him for counsel. Don't just think a couch and you just telling Him all your troubles, okay? It's way bigger than that. Okay, it is about completely trusting God's wisdom, completely trusting God's understanding, completely trusting His ways, completely trusting His Word. It's about going to Him for counsel. It's about telling Him every single thing in your heart. I labor with the saints, I teach this every week. You go to God and you tell Him everything. He knows it anyway. And don't just think sin. But when we're in sin, or in doubt, or fear, or something's not right, we tell Him we're quick to repent. Yes?

You repent with God. He wants that. He gave us an ability to do that. Thank You, Jesus, that we can repent. Thank You, Jesus, that we can repent, that we can change the way we're thinking. Truth? If you're afraid, you go to Him. Any area of our lives, we have the Spirit of counsel waiting on us for you to tell Him everything. Everything. Everything. Not just with problems. You tell Him everything. And counsel will be revealed to us by the Spirit. Everything, no matter what it is. Counsel will be given to us from God Almighty, the same counsel that was given to Jesus Christ, because the fullness rests on Him.

Don't just think when bad things happen. We need this every day. Yes? Say yes. And might works with it. Counsel and might. Might, above and beyond, Mighty God, power of God, Almighty God who always knows the right thing to do. At the right moment, at the right time,

He has all the answers, and He will come in power. Look what He did with Samson. That manifested on a real man. So if I would just pick one of you men here today, and it's okay, the Spirit of Might is upon you, now go out there and do all these things that He just did, you go, Wow! You have to make it real. It's not just a Bible story.

And the spirit of might is rested upon many men and women of God. Truth. Counsel and might, it is so vital that this is our lifestyle and be totally dependent on His grace and mercy. For every saint, you say, well, I just confessed my sins to God. No, no, you have to open your heart. You have to open your thoughts, your mind. You have to tell Him everything. Talk to Him. And when you're hurting, pour out your soul. When you can't go any further, pour out your soul. When you're angry and hurting and murderously angry, pour out your soul. When you're scared, when you have concern where you don't know what to need, whatever it may be, pour out your soul to Him, and counsel will minister to you.

Counsel will minister to you, and might will join. You have to see how He brings them together. You can have all of this. Jesus' grace and delight was in the fear of the Lord because that's where we all begin. Because the Spirit of the Lord is the beginning of all wisdom. Because if I fear the Lord, I am going to tell Him everything. I'm going to say, I need you here. Counsel me in this. I need you here. I need your power here. I need the might of the Lord. I need you here. You tell Him everything and only He can heal the depths of our wounds. Amen.

Now let's look at Micah 3:8. We are totally dependent on the Lord's grace and mercy. And that's very, very powerful. Say lifestyle. Lifestyle. We're learning how to yield our heart to His every day. Not My will, but Your will be done. That's what Jesus said, right? Not My will, but Your will be done. And Jesus walked in the fullness. The Spirit of the Lord was upon Him, in Him, over Him. Wow. Follow me. Who am I following? Lord God Almighty, wisdom, revelation, counsel, might, knowledge, the fear of God, power and authority. Who are we really serving? You're serving God Almighty in Christ. And grace and mercy is being poured out to us every day. We don't just go to church, beloved.

The prophet Micah says in Micah 3:8, but truly I am full of power by the Spirit of the Lord and of justice and might to declare to Jacob his transgressions and to Israel his sin. The Spirit of the Lord rested upon Micah the prophet as he proclaimed the word of the Lord to Israel. And that was the word of the Lord. And we have a whole book in the Bible about it. You can read it all. But he knew Jesus hadn't come yet. He did not have the Holy Spirit inside of him yet, but the Spirit of the Lord comes upon them, you understand, anoints them, covered in, smeared with, led by the Spirit of God upon him.

I am full of power. You hear that? I am full of power. We need, as Christians, to be able to say, I am full of power. Don't just wait for a deed to happen. We need to know that, whoa, every day, I am full of power. Yes? I am full of power by the Spirit of the Lord, and the Spirit of the Lord is the fullness over here. Don't cut the Spirit of the Lord short. Don't make Him wimpy to some wimpy comforter. He'll let you cry on His shoulder. This is the spirit of the sovereign Lord. Amen.

And he proclaims these words. I've come in justice and might, in justice and might, in justice and might, in justice and might. This is coming from the throne room of heaven, and I am bringing an order from heaven, and I'm going to declare to Jacob his transgression in Israel, his sin. You're like, oh, wow, that's not really what I was looking for. But that is the spirit of might, the spirit of counsel and might working together, because God Almighty brings them together, and from that, He puts the word of the Lord in the prophet's mouth, and He releases the judgment from heaven, from the courts of heaven. Thus says the Lord, right? That's what He's doing, and He declares it there. He declares it. He declares it. He wasn't Samson that went and pulled a gate off or slaughtered all thousands of Philistines. Yeah, he just spoke the word of the Lord, and God worked with that. You see it. Same spirit.

David was anointed by God to perform mighty acts of power. Most of us are familiar, but it was the spirit of might that David killed the giant Goliath. Most people have heard of this story. He mocked and tormented Israel every day. Okay. We know his amazing words that he spoke by the spirit of might upon David. In 1 Samuel 17:26, you can probably quote it back to me: Who is this uncircumcised Philistine that he should defy the armies of the living God? Right? Wow.

David testified of his personal training from the Lord. Look at 1 Samuel 17:34–37. It's what I want to read. He was anointed by God to perform mighty acts of power. The spirit of might came with counsel to David. Pretty amazing. Most of us today, without the Holy Ghost, if we saw the giant Goliath, we'd probably run faster than the wind. Seriously. Okay. It's not just a nice little story. This was real. There's a whole herd of those giants, right? Herd, whatever group.

But David said to Saul, 'Your servant used to keep his father's sheep. And when a lion or a bear would come, and took a lamb out of the flock, I went after it, and I struck it. And I delivered the lamb from its mouth, and when it rose against me, I caught it by its beard, and I struck it. Whoa! And your servant has killed both lion and bear. And this uncircumcised Philistine will be like one of them, seeing that he has defied the armies of the living God. Moreover, David said, The Lord who delivered me from the paw of the lion and the paw of the bear, He will deliver me from the hand of this Philistine. And Saul said to David, Well, go, and may the Lord be with you. Right, shakaba-ba, yay, good luck.

But David had the heart, and God trained him as a shepherd. And literally, the spirit of might that we're reading about would come upon him to do these things as he protected the sheep. He would soon become a king of Israel and he was still protecting the sheep. He still moved in the spirit of might all of his days. Truth? And he's coming again in regards to Israel and leading and being a king there, serving King Jesus. Amen. Okay, so think outside the box. Spirit of might is not dead. Amen?

We know that Jesus is king. Go to Psalm 145. We are anointed to perform mighty acts of power today. I love this psalm and these verses. Psalm 145:4–7 says, one generation shall praise Your works to another, and shall declare Your mighty acts. I will meditate on the glorious splendor of Your majesty, and all Your wondrous works. Men shall speak of the might of Your awesome acts, and I will declare Your greatness. They shall utter the memory of Your great goodness, and shall sing of Your righteousness.

You can take that whole Psalm, read it all, right here. Look at the truth. One generation to the next. One generation to the next shall praise God, yes, for all His works, all His mighty deeds, where God has intervened, where God has shown Himself strong, from one generation to the next. We don't know all the stories of every generation before us. I don't even know all the wonderful, glorious things that God's doing in all of your lives. There's too much to keep up with, but when there's a testimony, there's a testimony, but yet He is a miracle-working God working daily. And the Spirit of might is here. He is real still today. It wasn't just Samson. It wasn't just David.

One generation to the next shall praise Your works to another, shall declare Your mighty acts. I think of Charles Finney and a mighty intercessor during the war, too. I think it's World War II, and my God, how God raised him up to intercede over the mighty battles with Hitler and all that, and interceding. My God, saints came and miracles happen. Mighty works of God happen when the church prays. Amen? That's why we pray for Israel, we pray for the peace of Jerusalem, we pray for us, we pray for each other, our families, we pray for our nations, city, states, everywhere we have our feet.

One generation shall praise Your works to another. You tell your children, when I was 10, God did this for me. When I turned 30, I got saved, and this is what God did me. Your children should know every mighty act God did for you. Your children shall know how He led you to forgiveness and repentance. Those are mighty acts of God. Yes? Don't discount that. Well, I just got saved. No, no, no, no. No, you got plucked out of hell. So we should be testified of every good and perfect gift from above. Men will speak of the might. We will speak of the might. We will speak and declare of the might, how He rescues, how He saves us, how He forgives us, how He intervenes, how He did a supernatural wonder. We speak of the might of His awesome acts, not just when they were delivered from Egypt. People

default to that. Bing! It's not just when the people of Israel came out of Egypt. It started in Genesis 1, right? We will utter the memory of Your great goodness. That's our job. And we get to tell others, I will sing of Your righteousness.

Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior, fully anointed and empowered in the fullness of the Holy Ghost. Say fullness. Now we go to Acts 10:38. You know this. Say fresh oil from the Spirit of might. Acts 10:38 is a testimony of Christ. It says how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit. Every time you see Holy Spirit, you're thinking the fullness of who He is. Yes? Spirit of the Lord. Counsel might, wisdom, revelation, knowledge. You understand? The fullness. He was anointed with the Holy Spirit and with power. He went around doing good, understatement, healing all. Healing all. That's what my Bible says. Healing all. That's Jesus. Healing all. Say all. All. So if somebody tells you Jesus doesn't heal, no, Jesus healed them all. That's Bible doctrine. That's my Christ. Otherwise, you serve a form of some other religion that has denied the power of Christ because it didn't work for them. You see it? That's the fear of the Lord. No, no, no, no. I don't cut Jesus Christ short. We abide by His Word, and that's what He did in fullness. And that's who's living in us. So I'm going to align my doctrine up with the man, okay? I say amen. Amen. He knows what that looks like. I don't. I'm not God. Yes.

The Spirit of the Lord and power of the Apostle Paul in his weakness and his labor for the kingdom. Go to 2 Corinthians 12:9. We're not building a case because prayers aren't answered. We're building the kingdom of heaven to who Christ is. Truth. You can read all of 2 Corinthians 12 at home. What a marvelous God we serve. Wow. Now, I'm telling you, we talked about this last week, Grant did, with the Fresh Off the Press. When I wake up in the middle of the night and the Holy Ghost says this to me, you have to understand it's not just to have a sermon or entertain you or, well, I'm just trying to find something to say. Fresh Off the Press, the Holy Ghost, right, wants us to know this and receive it. There is fresh oil and impartation from every word, every word, every time we gather. Every time we gather, every single time we gather. Amen. Be encouraged. The Lord loves us.

Okay, 2 Corinthians 12:9, y'all good? This is the Apostle Paul talking. He says, okay, he said to me, the Lord is saying to him, My grace is sufficient for you, and for My strength is made perfect in weakness. Oh. I get this. Jesus said to him, My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness. That makes sense with humans. Yeah. Therefore, most gladly, I would rather boast of my infirmities and all my weaknesses, so the power of Christ may rest on me, so the fullness of the Spirit of the Lord will rest on me. Wisdom, revelation, power, wholeness, you see this. I will surely be weak so He can be strong. Now, when I can't make it another day, I'm out of breath. The Spirit of the Lord is upon me. Yes? Shift the way you're thinking. Wow, I'm going to boast about that. Hello, I'm Brandi. I am so

weak. But God is strong. Yes? That is the truth, so that the power of Christ can rest upon me.

Therefore, I take pleasure in my infirmities, in reproaches, in needs, in persecutions, in distresses, for Christ's sake, because when I am weak, then I am strong. You see it. You see the fullness of the Spirit of the Lord. Same Spirit didn't leave. The Spirit of the Lord is resting upon us, wisdom, counsel, might, understanding, knowledge of the fear of God. He hasn't changed, but He's ministering to us in our circumstances. He ministers to us as Christians because we're persecuted by the world, you understand? And He will never leave us fellows or forsake us.

Go to Psalm 112. Hallelujah. He releases supernatural abilities and strength within us. That's amazing. Psalm 112:1–3 says, Praise the Lord. Blessed is the man who fears the Lord. Now, every time you see that, you're thinking the spirit of the fear of the Lord, yes? Praise the Lord. Blessed is the man who fears the Lord, who delights greatly in His commandments. Verse 2 says, his descendants will be mighty on the earth. His descendants, the one who fears the Lord, will be mighty on the earth. Why? Because of the spirit of might. The generation of the upright will be blessed, empowered to prosper. Wealth and riches will be in his house. His righteousness endures forever.

Woo! Psalm 112:4–10 says, Unto the upright there arises light in the darkness. He's gracious, He's full of compassion and righteous. A good man deals graciously in lens. He will guide his affairs with discretion. Verse 6 says, Surely he will never be shaken. The righteous will be in everlasting remembrance. He will not be afraid of evil tidings. His heart is steadfast, trusting in the Lord. His heart is established. He will not be afraid, hallelujah, until he sees his desire upon his enemies. He's dispersed abroad, he's given to the poor. His righteousness endures forever. His horn will be exalted with honor. The wicked will see it and be grieved, and will gnash his teeth and melt away, and the desire of the wicked shall perish. Truth. Memorize it. Put it in your heart. Declare it. Confess it. See Christ in this passage because He is our head and He has done this for us. Yes. He made a way for the Spirit of God not just to come upon us but to be in us. Jesus said with God all things are possible. Did He not? Okay. He said with God all things are possible. Okay. With God, all things are possible.

So go to Psalm 92. We'll close with this scripture. Psalm 92 is one of my favorites, but we're going to read Psalm 92:8–11 out of the New Living Translation. So when we say, Lord, we stand in awe of You, it's like, yeah, we do. Thank You for Your supernatural strength. Amen. Psalm 92:8 says, But You, Lord, You'll be exalted forever. Your enemies, Lord, will surely perish. All evildoers will be scattered. But You have made me strong as a wild ox. You have

anointed me with the finest oil. My eyes have seen the downfall of my enemies, and my ears have heard the defeat of my wicked opponents.

Psalms 92:12 says, But the godly will flourish like palm trees, and grow strong like the cedars of Lebanon. For they are transplanted to the Lord's own house. Wow. They flourish in the courts of our God. Even in old age, they will still produce fruit. Oh, are you serious? And they will remain vital and green, and they'll declare the Lord is just. They will declare that the Lord is just. They'll declare that the Lord is right. He's my rock. There's no evil in Him. You hear it? That's a transformed heart.

And the Lord is encouraging us to come and abide and remember the fullness of the Sevenfold Spirit and counsel and might. Pour your hearts out. Open your hearts. And in the depths of some who are deeply hurting, He will come into those depths with the spirit of might to heal. You would think it would be the oil of the spirit of healing, right? Or maybe deliverance, but the spirit of might, the spirit of might, okay, will come in with counsel and go to the depths of your toenails, to the cells in your being, to everything that pertains to you and your destiny and purpose in God. And you get in there with Him and you listen to Him. And you take His word and you allow Him to minister. And you know that the Holy Ghost, we are, He were never alone. Yes?

So let's stand up. I want to honor this. And if you want to stay with Him for a minute when we're done, to just allow Him to minister to this. Otherwise, you get to go home and go there with Him in your closet. Amen? All right. Well, Father God, we honor Your word today. We receive it. We're listening. And I ask, Father, on behalf of myself and the family of God who have rejected the counsel of the Lord, therefore rejecting the Spirit of might. And I ask, Father, for a great new fresh impartation of Your Spirit and oil and grace, that You come and bring the church into the fullness of what You have planned for her, in the fullness of Your Spirit, Lord, according to Your will for each person.

Father God, we thank You that we will boast in our weaknesses because we know that where we are weak, You are strong and that You will never leave us, fail us, or forsake us. I thank You that You're long-suffering and that You labor with us and You help us time and time again. And I thank You, Jesus, for Your anointing and that You have chosen to lead as example, that You are full. You are full. You lack nothing. We love You so much. I just bless everyone hearing these words today. They'd be encouraged and strengthened. Meditate upon these words this week. In Jesus' name, amen. Amen. All right, well, God bless you.
